# Little Koala



a paper pieced pattern



10"BLOCK



## Hello!

I hope you enjoy making this block! This pattern makes a sweet little koala. They're such an iconic part of Australian wildlife and well loved. But don't call them bears - they're not;) They are however marsupials and pretty fascinating animals.

There's a colouring sheet included so that you can plan out your block layout before you start sewing. I highly recommend marking the paper piecing templates with which colour/fabric goes where to make it easier when it's time to piece the block.

## paper piecing tips

Foundation piecing is a technique where you sew fabric onto paper to get an end design. You can find plenty of tutorials online to get you started. Following are a few hints and tips that will make your paper piecing go a little more smoothly.

\* When printing the pattern, make sure it is printed at "Actual Size" or "with no scaling" (phrasing will differ depending on your printer). Check the orientation of the paper for printing. You can also use this 1" box to check your pattern is printing accurately.

1"Squake

- \* Shorten the stitch length on your sewing machine before you do anything else! Set it to less than 1.5. This will make it easier to remove the paper at the end.
- \* When it comes to piecing angles, use a larger section of fabric to ensure it will cover the whole + the seam allowance. You can find a tutorial on my blog that may help you.
- \* Backstitch at the starts and ends of each line (inside the shape, don't sew into the seam allowance) to keep your seams secure once you remove the paper.

## assembling your block


Print out one copy of the paper piecing templates. Piece each section in order as shown on the templates. Iron each section well, then trim the sections back to the seam allowance (dotted lines on the templates).

Join the sections together in the following order:

A+B DEF+G ABC+DEFGHI

AB+C DEFG+H D+E+F DEFGH+I


For section J, cut a piece of background fabric measuring 2" x 10.5" and add to the top of the block.





Some sections do join on an angle, so take your time lining them up.


If you're not confident it will line up straight away, join with a large basting stitch (go with the largest stitch size on your machine), and check if you're happy with it. If it's not quite lined up, unpick and redo it. Once you're happy with how the sections have joined, re-sew with the smaller stitch.




#### ABOUT KOALA BLOCK











Unfinished Block Size: 10.5" Finished Block Size: 10"




Use this diagram when laying out your pieces wrong side up ready to hand piece




### **W** HANDY TIP!


When you see a stitching line with a point or pivot spot, don't try to pin all the edges that need stitching. Pin the first straight edge and stitch, do a back stitch at the end.


You'll likely need to pivot your fabric to pin the next section, then pin and stitch and continue until the end.
















































