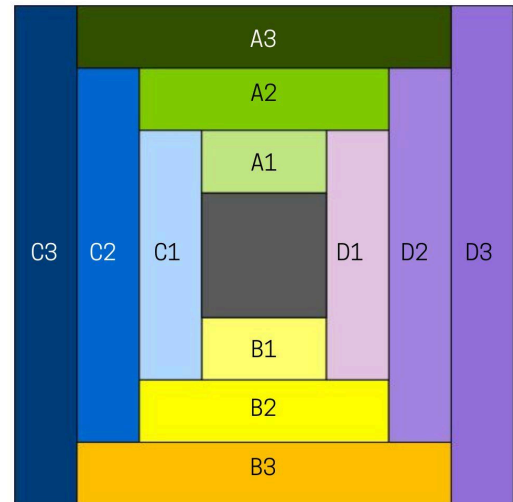


Courthouse Steps
Exchange at August meeting

Dark centers, 4 different colors for log sections
14" finished, use 2 1/2" strips

Please note, my colors are for illustration only. Mix in red, orange, neutrals, browns...anything goes!

Logs can be all one fabric or as scrappy as you want to be.



Start with a 2 1/2" square in the center.

Cut fabric for one block:

A and B sections, 1 of each color

A1/B1 - 2 1/2" square, A2/B2 - 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle, A3/B3 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle

C and D sections, 1 of each color

C1/D1 - 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle, C2/D2 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle, C3/D3 - 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangle

Piecing:

Sew A1 and B1 squares on opposite sides of center square. Press away from center on all sections. Add smallest C1 and D1 rectangles to remaining sides of the center square. Press after each side is added.

Repeat with medium cuts, adding A2 and B2 rectangles to opposite sides, then adding C2 and D2 rectangles. Keep color sections consistent.

Add largest A3 and B3 rectangles, then finish the block with C3 and D3 rectangles.

Trim to 14 1/2".
